

Cervical Cancer

Cervical cancer begins when abnormal changes develop in the cells of the cervix. Cervical cancer is most frequently the result of human papillomavirus (HPV). Common treatments include surgery to remove the cancer cells, medicines such as chemotherapy and targeted therapy, and radiation. Worldwide, it is the fourth most common cancer for women. On average, the age of diagnosis for cervical cancer patients is younger than many other cancer types.
